In response to a plea from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and Church World Service the Presbytery Disaster Response Team is coordinating a collection of Cleanup Buckets and Hygiene kits for the survivors of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma. We have set a goal of a 1000 cleanup buckets to be collected by the Presbytery by October 3! This is a very needed activity that we can do now in response to these immense disasters. Buckets can be dropped off at the church office or at Staunton First Presbyterian Church, 100 East Frederick Street. Questions? - Contact Tom Compton at 540-529-5082 or tcc054@comcast.net.

Cleanup Bucket Value \$75 (Processing fee \$3)

- 1 5-gallon bucket with re-sealable lid*
- 5 scouring pads
- 7 sponges, assorted sizes
- 1 scrub brush
- pkg. cleaning towels (18 reusable, like Easy Wipes®)
- 1 box dry laundry detergent, 50-78 oz.
- 1 liquid concentrated household cleaner (like Lysol®), 12 oz. (This is difficult to find. Amazon.com may be the best place to find it.)
- 1 bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn®), 24-28 oz.
- 1 1 pkg. clothespins, 48-50 Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.
- 5 dust masks 2 pair latex gloves (like Playtex®)
- 1 pair work gloves
- 1 24 to 28 count roll heavy-duty trash bags (30-45 gallon, remove from carton)
- 1 bottle insect repellant (pump, drops or lotion; not aerosol), 6-9 oz.

Please purchase all liquids in plastic bottles. Send only new, unopened materials. Put all items in the plastic bucket, packed securely to avoid damage during shipment, and seal lid with packing tape. DO NOT PUT CASH OR MESSAGES IN THE KIT.

Hygiene Kit Value \$15 (Processing fee \$2)

- 1 hand towel (approximately 16" x 28", no fingertip or bath towels)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 wide-tooth comb (remove from package)
- 1 nail clipper (UPDATE: nail clippers with metal files or emery boards attached are now accepted; remove from package)
- 1 bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- 1 toothbrush (in original packaging)
- 10 Band-Aids® or other adhesive bandage strips

Please do not add toothpaste to the Hygiene Kit. Toothpaste which has an extended expiration date will be added to international Hygiene Kit shipments just prior to shipment. Seal all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure. DO NOT PUT CASH OR MESSAGES IN THE KIT.


