Connect with the Pastor ...

As I write this on the eve of Holy Week it dawns on me that Jesus was roughly the age of our son Daniel at the time of his crucifixion and resurrection. That seems awfully young – young to suffer so, young to die, young to have



such an impact on history and upon our lives! We sometimes think of Jesus as timeless – a man of indeterminate age who spoke with the wisdom of an ancient sage while garnering the love, respect, and hate of people of all ages long ago in a land far away. But the reality is that Jesus was born, lived, and died within our time and space. He walked the dusty roads of Palestine for only 33 years. He celebrated birthdays, stopped to eat lunch, and laid down his head to rest at night. He stubbed his toes on stones, mourned the death of friends, and got the flu. His incarnation affirms that Jesus fully experienced what it is to be human and so understands what our lives are like day to day. But it also affirms that in his betrayal and gruesome death he understands human suffering – suffering on a scale that we hope never to experience!

It has been said that Christians emphasize Jesus' humanity too much at his birth and his divinity too much at his resurrection. The two are entwined on those days and across all the days in between. So, before you rush from Palm Sunday's hosannas to Easter's alleluias, from the man riding on the donkey to the savior rising from the tomb, take time to reflect on the reality of the events of this week. Remember the crucifixion and Jesus' cry from the cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me!"

Finally, forsythia and daffodils are blooming, and the sun is shining warmly (some days, at least). It's time for spring cleaning: Shine up those windows, shake out the rugs and. . . clear out old medicines. Check your medicine cabinets, bedside tables, travel bags and other odd spots where you've stashed those last four tablets of Augmentin or the leftovers from the muscle relaxer prescribed several years ago. Check the label: Somewhere in small print is a "discard by" date. That date is sometimes an edict, occasionally a suggestion. Although some medicines and vitamins are "good" beyond their expiration dates, most aren't – and not only become less effective over time, but can cause adverse reactions when used with others. Ask your pharmacist for the "real" expiration date – and use a bold marker to note it on the pill bottle.

While you're at it, make sure your personal medication list is current – and make a copy to carry with you.

Next, check to insure all your medicines — prescribed and over -the-counter — work well together: I have occasionally discovered some unintended (and potentially ugly) side effects caused by using two or more seemingly helpful medications at the same time. Ask your pharmacist for interaction details, or try one of the following easy-to-use charts at www.drugs.com or www.webmd.com.

To make your drug cleanup job easier, Greater Augusta Prevention Partners is sponsoring "Drug Take Back Day," 10:00 AM - 2:00 PM, Saturday, April 27. Toss your old meds and vitamins into a bag and take them to one of the following locations: Parking lots at Fisher Auto Parts (across from Staunton Kroger); Neighborhood Market on Broad Street, Waynesboro; Augusta County Sheriff's Office, Verona. Happy cleaning!




