As we wind down another year of Sunday school, Bible studies, and formal Christian education programming at Covenant, I have been reflecting upon the wealth of educational opportunities that I have witnessed this church school year. We began our year with a spectacular Rally Day celebration in which we sang songs, danced, checked out Christian education opportunities, and then cheered our voungest friends on as they went to their Sunday school classrooms for the first time.



Each Monday, a devoted group of individuals has met with John or me to look over the Scripture passage for the following Sunday -- often offering insights that were very new and very helpful for us! We also offered two different Bible studies after TOW this vear about women in the Bible as well as different titles for Jesus.

The adult Sunday school classes continued to provide a variety of opportunities to fit spiritual needs through book studies, formal Bible studies, and discussions on current events and social justice issues. Even our unofficial class, the "Saints and Sinners" group, met each week, checking in with one another and spending time in Christian fellowship.

Every third Friday of the month, children from 2nd through 8th grade ran through the halls of our church, playing games, participating in service projects, and studying the Bible. 

#### Nursing Nook with Kathy Henderson, RN







#### WHAT IS CSA?

Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) is a subscription program that enables consumers in our local community to both take part in, as well as help support, our growing season. Beginning in the spring, we compile shares of the veggies from the Project GROWS farm for weekly pick-up for all our CSA members. We continue to harvest for CSA pick-ups each week until the end of our season in mid-October. Being a CSA member allows you to enjoy the freshest produce while investing in your local community and supporting local agriculture.

#### WHAT IS THE COST?

A 20-week share of vegetables from Project GROWS is \$25/week or \$500 for the season. As a non-profit educational farm, we consider \$150 of that cost as a tax deductible donation to our educational programming.

#### WHEN AND WHERE DO I PICK-UP VEGGIES?

CSA members may choose to sign up for one of two pick-up locations: Project GROWS Farm (608 Berry Farm Road, Verona, VA 24482 - about 4.5 miles outside of Staunton) OR Waynesboro Boys & Girls Club (302 East Main Street, Waynesboro, VA 22980—near downtown Waynesboro). Shares are picked up by members weekly on Tuesdays between 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM.

### Little GROWers Summer Camp




