I. Task Force Mission Statement

II. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Farrier Court Summer Lunch Program Update provided by Janie Ballurio
 - Summer 2018, a Covenant group received training and served food child attendance was very slim
 - Summer 2019, Janie offered activities after lunch every Thursday in June and July
 - o Attendance numbers dwindled considerably as summer progressed
 - The Farrier Court building had an approximately half hour time limit for which to conduct indoor activities; when kids did arrive, this limited the duration of the activity
 - Farrier Court is considering not offering lunch at this location due to lack of attendance
 - o Program is NOT recommended for the Task Force next year
 - Possibly consider a revamped program of this nature in a different location in the future

III. NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Rally Day Sept. 8 Covenant Task Force to have a table in the Great Hall from 9:30-10:20
 - Karen Peterson and Eileen Cooper to create a visual display with our Mission Statement and pictures of past events. Display will include sign up sheets for tutoring and First Friday volunteers and handout describing our programs

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- Cary Dahl, Karen Peterson, Janie Ballurio, and others to be present to answer questions
- B. Shelburne Middle School UPDATE by Peggy Roberson
 - a. Pending a concern was raised that we need to take steps to ensure safeguards so that any assistance we provide reaches the intended beneficiary
- C. Boys and Girls Club:
 - a. Spirit Nights one per month planned in area breweries and wineries 10% of proceeds to be donated to the Boys and Girls Program an opportunity to meet Boys and Girls Club Board members and employees, and find ways of helping. Next one: Skipping Rock Sept. 8th 1-3 p.m. (October Yelping Dog)
 - b. Tutoring
 - i. Karen Peterson provided an update:
 - Quiet study space (The Power Place) in Staunton redesigned by Covenant Task Force; other spaces redesigned by the Boys and Girls Club as well
 - Tutors have started and thus far it is going much better than last year
 - Timing is an issue buses are arriving much later than last year
 - Younger kids are not going to the quiet space a way of incorporating younger kids to receive tutoring assistance is needed
 - Karen plans to talk to Scott Morris, Boys and Girls Club Staunton site manager, to find out how they can work out a better schedule and help the younger kids
 - Covenant donation of books for the new quiet study space well received by the Boys and Girls Club kids
 - Potential to ask Outreach for funding to help with needed pieces of furniture, décor items for the quiet study space – Tutor subcommittee to compile a list of needs and estimated costs
 - Stu Allen built a beautiful bookshelf that is specifically targeted for younger kids
 - Tutor subcommittee may plan to meet separately to work out any issues
 - c. First Fridays Program Creating a three-year rotational curriculum Robyn is working on a binder with all of the plans
 - i. FALL 2019, Scheduled for September, October, November, December, to include elements of:
 - 1. Construction building a Christmas Tree Gypsy Hill Display
 - 2. Design create a one-of-a-kind ornament that the kids design and paint with Makerspace Planning TOUR of Makerspace for Covenant Volunteers

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- 3. Food high energy snacks and ways to celebrate the upcoming holidays with James (receiving donation from Polyface)
- 4. See attached First Fridays sheet for more information

D. Community Organizations:

- a. YMCA Update David Stahl stated there is an opportunity to help provide and assemble snacks; monetary donations are also welcome
- b. Laundromat Literacy Program Karen Peterson had nothing to report
- c. Barbershop Books Ron Ramsey with an update on information gathering
 - A Barbershop Book kit is available for purchase for \$475 that would provide a barbershop a stand, books, and 30+ books for restock – the company that provides the kit gives callbacks to the shop to see what other supplies they need
 - Question raised as to whether or not this opportunity to allow for any personal interaction, as that is an important element of the Task Force directive – Ron will do further research and report back
 - Ron will ask Chris Lassiter if Barbershops are gathering points in Staunton or if there are other suggested target businesses
 - An article will be provided on the Task Force webpage with more information
- d. Nutrition a focus for many task force members: New ideas brought forth
 - o Research at the Boys and Girls Club:
 - Look into the USDA grant to see what is included and if there is a
 way of using the grant to provide a greater amount of nutrition for
 snacks and dinner for the Club (if a greater amount of autonomy
 can be used for food selection)
 - Contact Project Grows to see if we can get fresh produce
 - Possibly contact Crystal Moyers and Dan O'Conner from Augusta Health to see if there is surplus food from their Project Grows garden available
 - David Stahl and Janie Ballurio to do further research
