I once heard that 33% of ministers will leave ministry altogether within their first 5 years of ordained ministry. That's not a great statistic. The PCUSA, in an attempt to combat these numbers has partnered with the Episcopal Church to offer CREDO (Clergy Reflection, Education, Discernment Opportunity) for ministers who are in their first 5 years of ordained ministry. Newly ordained clergy are invited to spend a week at a retreat center, engaging in reflection and discernment.



On Tuesday, I will head to Florida to spend a week with 15 other newly-ordained clergy. We will spend our week checking in with each other, meeting with experts in financial planning, spiritual health, physical health, and professional discernment. At the end of the week, we will be sent back to our own respective contexts with goals to work on for the next year. We'll meet again next September to see how we've done, to see what we've celebrated in the past year, and to see what we're struggling with.

I am looking forward to this time away, to recharge and reflect on my past year in ministry. I look forward to sharing all of the wonderful things that are going on at Covenant with ministers from all over the United States. I am grateful that the PCUSA has recognized that this is an important ministry of our Church. I am grateful that our denomination has created space for us newly-ordained clergy.

Nursing Nook with Kathy Henderson, RN

Common wisdom: Eating clean is good for Mother Earth and her children. Common knowledge: Eating clean is expensive. For those of us trying to keep families, budgets and planet healthy, this is a dilemma. Almost 70 percent of all non-organic produce sold in the U.S. contains pesticide residue, the Environmental Working Group (EWG) tells us. EWG, a well-respected watchdog group, annually analyzes

USDA test data to create "Shopper's Guide to Pesticide in Produce, "including" Dirty Dozen

"and" Clean 15 lists of produce.

Our filthiest non-organic food? **Strawberries**, with **spinach** close behind. This year's surprise entry: "**superfood**" **kale**, with 92 percent of all samples carrying at least two pesticides and almost 60 percent testing positive for Dacthal, a suspected carcinogen long banned in Europe. Also included in the "Dirty Dozen: **Nectarines**, **apples**, **grapes**, **peaches**, **cherries**, **pears**, **tomatoes**, **celery and potatoes**. The research is extensive, the news disheartening, but there are "**clean foods**" that seem to carry little pesticide residue They are: **Avocados**, **sweet corn**, **pineapple**, **cabbages**, **onions**, **sweet peas**, **papaya**, **asparagus**, **mangoes**, **eggplants**, **kiwis**, **canta**

loupe, cauliflower and broccoli.

To clean non-organic produce: Wash thoroughly under *running* water; scrubbing with a soft brush, peeling skins where possible. Do not wash produce until ready to use. A new one to me: 1 tablespoon baking soda mixed into a gallon of water, used to soak certain produce like apples. (I tried it on cucumbers and couldn't taste the soda.)

Best advice I found after trawling the internet: Eat organic (wash first!) when possible and affordable, but don't panic if you're using non-organic.

From Faith's Heart — Nigeria

According to UNICEF's 2018 annual country report on Nigeria, there are about 10.5 million children ages five to 14 years who are not in school. Many of these are young girls. Nigeria is consistently ranked with one of the highest gender inequality rates worldwide. In 2018, among 149 countries, Nigeria ranked 139 on the World Economic Forum's Gender Gap Index.

Girls across Nigeria are involved in various forms of apprenticeship and child labor. They have fewer educational

opportunities, are at great risk for violence and abuse, and the trades they typically learn have less economic potential than their male counterparts.

Decapolis Community Development Centers will aim to offer young girls equal educational and earning potential opportunities. The skill sets they develop at our centers will also help to make more informed decisions concerning their own lives and help them create gainful employment opportunities within their own communities and off of the city streets. As we share the Gospel with them in practical ways, these young girls will learn their worth in Christ — the Defender of the defenseless.

New things are happening in the Youth Ministry this Fall.

The Sunday School hour at 9:30AM will give youth an opportunity to study God's word with two groups — one for 6th-9th graders and one for 10th-12th graders.

During Sunday School in September and October, the 2nd and 3rd grade class will be studying the different elements of worship in Worship 101. They will meet in the green room in the Preschool area. Then during the 10:30 worship service, they are encouraged to stay and see what they have learned in Sunday School and how it actually happens in the worship service.

Following the children's sermon in the 10:30 worship service, children age 3—1st grade are invited to attend Covenant Kids in the new Covenant Kids Room (Room 4) to learn more about the topic of that morning's sermon. Children will spend their time learning about the Bible story, singing songs, play games, reading books, and/or making crafts related to that morning's text. Our hope is that this time will give families a lot to talk about after worship!



A special study at 9:30AM on Sundays in November in Room 3 will read and discuss Shea Tuttle's new book, *Exactly as You Are*. Tuttle looks at Fred Rogers' life, the people and places that made him who he was, and his work through *Mister Rogers' Neighborhood*. She pays particular attention to his faith—because Fred Rogers was a deeply spiritual person, ordained by this church to minister to children and families through television.

Steeple for the People Project

Hearing the origination story of our church at the 60th celebration was a delightful memory shared in the room that day. The careful planning and the extraordinary measures taken to build a solid structure in which to worship together and to break bread together to learn and grow as disciples of Christ was an inspiring way to affirm the work of your Facilities Team.

We have begun to tackle some big projects, with some big equipment, that pertain to the exterior of our building. The weather and the wildlife have taken its toll on our steeple, soffits, frieze boards, trim, and gutters. Over the next few weeks, contractors Fort Construction and Senger Roofing will be attending to these concerns: replacing and upgrading materials, patching, caulking, and painting will abound. Please keep an eye out for the movement of the heavy equipment during the next few weeks as we incrementally move around the building to reach the high altitude areas. The big lift will be in use on Saturdays, September 21st and 28th. The office and preschool entrance area could be blocked: especially on these dates and in the weeks ahead travel slow and with caution. Our Facilities Team crew also will be tackling the maintenance projects closer to the ground.




