**Into the Light: Finding Hope through Prayers of Lament**, the Presbyterian Women's Bible Study for this year has been remarkably timely. When the author and illustrator of the study, Lynn Miller, completed the series three years ago, neither she nor the publisher, **Horizons**, could have known. Who among us has not lamented something or someone in recent months? The fifth lesson, *Lamenting Life*, focuses on Job and begins with this opening prayer:

God of comfort, you have called each of us into being, and you call each of by name. You know us completely and you love us in Jesus Christ. Through your word and our words, speak to our lives that we may know you are with us always. Amen. (p. 45)

The illustration for the lesson features an hour glass. Do you remember the soap opera, *Days of Our* Lives? The intro was "Like sands through the hour glass, so are the days of our lives. . ." Thinking about the days of our lives like that sand in the hour glass, how many grains do we let slip through? How many grains or days do we use well? How do we react when presented with opportunities?

When Job was tested, his friends said he must have done something wrong. Job responded to each in turn that he had remained steadfast. He had used each of the grains of sand in his hour glass wisely and well. Now, hopefully we will not be tested like Job, but we might want to give thought to how well and wisely we are using the days of our lives?

You're in line at the grocery store. Your grocery cart is full and the person behind you has only a few items. Did you let that person go ahead of you? Are there clothes in the closet that could be donated to the Valley Mission? There are countless persons whom we encounter who could use a friendly greeting, or a child who is struggling with virtual learning who could use a word of encouragement or a teacher who is worn thin from the demands virtual teaching who could use a word of encouragement. Is there something you could say or do?

The point: The days of our lives are finite. The LORD has given us those days to use wisely and well before they slip through that hour glass!

Prayer: God of comfort, help us to be like Job, remaining steadfast using our days wisely and well and to the glory of God! Amen!

## Boys and Girls Club -

## Shelburne Project -

We continue to collect toiletry items and nonperishable food items for Shelburne Middle School families. The hygiene items and nonperishable foods will always be useful, but we are also collecting school supplies . . . items such as backpacks, hand sanitizer, and binders . . . to have on hand for students for school. **FYI** . . . as far as serving our kids . . . we have 105 families at last count who are asking for food.
