It hardly seems possible that almost a year has passed since we were all together – but then again maybe it seems more than possible, for the virus has wreaked havoc on all our lives in various ways, and the characteristic to except the control of the

it is people who are afflicted with this virus, people who are asked to social distance and wear masks and wash hands seemingly all day every day, people who are dying from this virus, people who are being vaccinated to ward it off.

Lent is a season for reflection and repentance, a season to pause and take stock of God's world and your place in it, a season to give up something in remembrance of what Jesus gave up for us (his life) or to take on something in a faithful way. Let me suggest that this year in addition to whatever other Lenten practices you practice, you give up one thing and take on one thing. The thing I suggest you give up is impatience. We all are impatient for this virus to leave us, impatient to get back together, impatient for our turn to come to get the vaccine, impatient for life to return to normal. Being impatient will not bring us any closer to any of those desired goals, but it will make the waiting worse and our lives more miserable and our spirits more irritable and may even push us into some hasty, ill-advised actions. The joy of our hearts has ceased; our dancing has turned to mourning, our hearts are sick. Restore to us a peaceful city where your people live and work together in unity, equity, and equality.

Restore jobs and give us our daily bread so that no one goes hungry.

Remove the COVID virus from our city and the rest of the world.

Fill your churches with people who praise your name above heaven and earth.

Restore us to yourself, O Lord, that we may be restored.

A prayer for now: Thank you, LORD, for bringing us this far. Thank you, LORD, for being present with us this day and in all the days to come. Thank you, LORD! Amen.




OPEN TABLE(s)

STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE

Our giving for 2020 ended strong as giving exceeded our budget of \$577,558! Our thanks to all those who so generously shared their resources through these challenging times and to the Session teams who did a fine job in controlling expenses. Year-end financials are as follows:

General Fund Receipts \$586,895 Less General Fund Expenses -\$542,409 Less Reinvested Dividends - \$3,302 Net General Fund \$40,184 Preschool Receipts \$75,231 - \$96,748 Less Preschool Expenses Net Preschool - \$21,517 Net Total Funds \$18,667

We anticipated the preschool loss as we had limited spaces available due to COVID, and school was suspended for the last two months of the school year in the spring. Teachers have done a great job to maintain continuity of the program in a safe environment for children and staff alike, and we are hopeful of returning to full enrollment in the fall. In most years, the preschool has generated a surplus at full enrollment, and we are grateful for this vital ministry of our church. In addition to the above figures, there is a \$94,000 Payroll Protection Program (PPP) loan which was secured in the spring which enabled us to purchase equipment and supplies to address COVID and to cover staff expenses for the church, including preschool teachers and nursery workers, throughout the year. In coming weeks we will be applying for loan forgiveness under the PPP program, and if it is approved, will have these funds available in addition to the net surplus indicated above. Our pledges for 2021 are down about \$12,000 from 2020. but we are hopeful that as we move out from under the cloud of this pandemic. we may again realize growth in our budget to support our vital ministries. Thank you for your faithfulness! God is indeed good — all the time!

Boys and Girls Club

We continue to participate in the Nextrex Program. So far we have collected 440 pounds of plastic bags to go towards a park bench. 500 pounds = 1 bench. Collect your bags and bring to the church office vestibule to drop in a designated receptacle, or drop off at RefillRenew, 110-1 Baldwin St. Also, we need volunteers to



help with taking the bags collected at the church to Food Lion. Volunteers will need to weigh the bags (there is a luggage scale next to the receptacle at the church), advise Robyn of the weight, and drop bags off at Food Lion. Donate supplies to Boys and Girls Club: school supplies (especially dry erase pens, lined paper, Kindergarten lined paper, pencils, crayons, and colored pencils). Look for a drop off box in the church office vestibule.

Shelburne Middle School Project

Items continue to be accepted for students and their families. Assorted food items

such as cereal, packaged snacks, peanut butter, jelly, and pasta sauce are always welcome. With the move to a hybrid school schedule and most students at the school for breakfast and lunch two days a week, the more important needs have shifted to hygiene items. Donations of shampoo, deodorant, hand sanitizer, toothbrushes, tissues, etc. are now in demand. Collection boxes are located at the church in the vestibule by the office.


