Almost as soon as a baby is born, that baby is swaddled in a blanket. Lots of children carry their 'blankie' with them throughout toddler-hood. Think about Linus and how important his blanket is to him. Children take enormous pleasure at having their blankets 'tucked in' by a loving adult at bedtime. And a sick child is comforted when wrapped in a warm blanket and snugaled into 'feeling better.'

Did you ever arrange the dining room chairs and top them with blankets to create a tent when you were a kid? And teenagers can burrow themselves under blankets. More than one college freshman packed a special blanket amongst the things they brought from home. Throughout our lives, blankets are important to us. In fact, in many traditions, caskets are covered with a kind of blanket called a pall for the funeral. Throughout our lives blankets warm us, comfort us, and provide security.



But what if there was no blanket? Perhaps homeless. Or trying to survive a disaster of some kind. Lost. Afraid. How very precious a blanket might be. Out of a desire to provide the familiar warmth, comfort and security of a blanket, Church World Service seeks monetary gifts in their annual campaign to purchase and distribute blankets where and to whom blankets are needed and can help. Blood Pressure 101 (A Refresher note)

Heart Health Month has passed, but the need to track our blood pressure should be a year-round effort. We all know the magic "less than 120/80" reading we're supposed to maintain (see the accompanying chart). Yes, those numbers indicate that our hearts are pumping along efficiently, moving blood through our bodies smoothly, but *please* remember that everyone's "norm" is different. Talk with your health provider about what your norm is.

As the church's "BP Lady," I'm often asked what brand of home BP monitor is most accurate – and how best to use it. Omron, LifeSource and Welch-Allyn are three well-known, reputable brands that come in a variety of price ranges. Although the American Heart Association and most medical providers recommend monitors that use arm cuffs, wrist monitors can be a good alternative for users uncomfortable with (or unable to manage) the cuff style. Consistency is the key to accurate monitoring. Check your home kit against your physician's – or mine. When checking BP at home:

- Keep a small notebook, noting dates, times and what you were doing just before checking. Although the American Heart Association suggests checking at set times of day, random readings may supply a more accurate picture of your true "heart health."
- Sit quietly, back straight and feet on the floor (No crossed legs! No chatting with other people in the room!), with your arm supported on a flat surface.
- If your reading looks "off" (significantly higher or lower than your norm), remove the cuff from your arm, wait a few minutes and try again.

Check the American Heart Association's user-friendly website, <u>www.heart.org</u> for helpful information. Feel free to call/text/email me with questions. I'm also available for "front-porch" BP checks.

With the move to a hybrid school schedule and most students at the school for breakfast and lunch two days a week, the more important needs have shifted to hygiene items. Donations of shampoo, deodorant, hand sanitizer, toothbrushes, tissues, etc. are now in demand. Collection boxes are located at the church in the vestibule by the office.



The website is user-friendly, and provides an easy way to see that (or if) your name is actually on the list. If you prefer to avoid computers, call the Virginia COVID-19 Vaccine Information Call



Center at 1-877-829-4682. You'll be asked to punch a few buttons ("enter zip code," "are you over 75?" etc), but you will eventually be asked to "Press 1 to preregister." At that point, a live person will come on the line to register you for an appointment – or confirm that your name is actually on a waiting list. Meanwhile, keep checking CVS's website (cvs.com) to see if any appointments have become available. Good luck, and — as always — feel free to call/text/email me with questions or suggestions.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

At its meeting on February 21, the Session took the following actions:

- Approved Covenant's 2020 PCUSA statistical report reflecting an increase in membership from 460 to 465
- Approved continuing with virtual-only worship on Sunday mornings
- Approved inviting the congregation to participate in an opportunity to support Crystal Gosnell Raphael in the purchase of land for her mission project in Nigeria
- Approved distribution of the 2020 surplus in the amount of \$18,667 as follows: \$10,000 to Outreach,

\$4,000 to Facilities for thermostat upgrades, \$3,401 to Personnel for

staff bonuses,

\$750 to Fellowship for mission activities.

\$516 to Stewardship & Finance for the Audit reserve fund

- Approved two projects to improve lighting in the north and west parking lots
- Appointed Kristin Siegel to the Long-Range Planning Committee
