From the Youth Director's Desk

"Transition is hard." This has become my mantra over the last couple years. Whether it's the transition for the kids coming home from school, the swing of masking and un masking as the CDC color code ebbs and flows, or larger things like moving from home school to in-person school. Change is lovely, but the process can be tough. In some ways, acknowledging the struggle has been helpful for our family. We try to plan ahead for the moments of transition, and when things go awry we say, "It's okay! Transitions are hard...but it will be okay."

Last fall, a big transition for our family was the switch from homeschooling to attending Eastern Mennonite School. Aubrey was in full day school for the first time as a Kindergartener. Carter and Mason entered as 7th and 8th graders. It was a big transition for all of us, but we planned ahead and welcomed the change.

This coming fall is bringing a transition for me that I did not plan ahead for. A couple weeks ago, a position for a middle/high school math teacher opened up at Eastern Mennonite. Our family doesn't tend to make quick decisions, but God was nudging so I inquired about the position. One of the hardest pieces of the transition this past year for our kids into EMS was that the busy hours in their schedule were in direct contrast with mine. When EMS offered me the job, we took some time to process together if it was the right next



FROM THE YOUTH DIRECTOR'S DESK (contd)

step in my journey. After difficult and careful thought, I have decided to step down as Youth Director at Covenant.

This summer, the youth at Covenant had an extra month of Sunday school because they were loving getting together so much that they requested more! During that month, we explored binaries in the Bible. One of the binaries was light/dark. I asked, "If you had to choose to have only one - light or dark - and the other ceased to exist, which would you choose?" At first, some said light. Then the conversation moved to what all is lost when the darkness ceases to exist. Shadows, therefore dimensions. The ability to see stars is gone if there isn't an element of darkness to allow us to see that light. Do you even know that light is light? Can there be light without dark? This conversation moved into the biblical connection of light/dark to good/bad. Rather than seeing things as all good or all bad, perhaps there is value, or dimension, in seeing both the good and bad in situations. This might even alleviate the common Christian/human struggle of, "Why do bad things happen?" Rather than defining a "bad thing", perhaps we can find the stars...even when things are mostly dark.

My stars in leaving this position are: gratitude for having served a congregation that is intentionally welcoming to youth; relationships I have built with the youth; a continued opportunity to serve alongside our youth as a fellow congregant at Covenant; personal faith transformation that I can only attribute to the experience

of holding the responsibility of encouraging our youth in independent thought around the intersection of faith and life... there are many more - innumerable.

One of the advantages to Covenant being my family's church home is that I will be here. I'll be here through the transition of finding the next person to step in. I can help, but we need others to help as well. Somethina I have learned about middle and high school youth is that they are eager to help and participate, but will almost never invite themselves into a group or situation - they need an invite. We need adult advocates in the congregation who look for opportunities to plug the youth into the workings of the church. They can do so much more than we give them. They are dreamers, helpers, hard workers, and advocates for social justice. In addition to plugging the youth into the life of the church, we need 2 more Sunday school teachers and one adult to help with a monthly youth group discussion time.

Transitions are hard, but I am grateful for the opportunity to continue striving to be faithful disciples of Christ: worshiping with joy, growing in faith, and serving in love... together.

DECAPOLIS PROJECT: THANKS FROM CRYSTAL!

How can we convey our joy and gratitude to you for your investment and prayers?

It is such an encouragement to have you all praying and investing in the Decapolis ministry. Sometimes it feels like this vision the Lord has given us is overwhelming and too big for us, but not for Him! We just keep trusting and taking the next step, and through the communal efforts of His people across the globe, we are moving forward! You are a huge part of these efforts.

To make the best use of the construction workers and the funds, we will begin the project once we have the bulk of the money in hand. Thanks to your generous donations of \$4717, more than 25 percent of the total is in hand.

In the meantime, we gear up for the Decapolis Farms 2022 planting season. We anticipate the harvest will double this year. Through a series of God'stiming moments, we have potentially found a local source for an effective and affordable organic fertilizer and will test the product on a 2-hectare plot of land. Several farmers are learning how to better provide for their families through a subsidized training/mentoring project incorporating modern planting protocols, semi-mechanized planting methods, and proper land management.

The insecurity in the country grows worse every day - kidnappings, armed robbery attacks are rampant. With national elections in just 8 months, it will only increase. We ask for your continued prayers for Ralph's safety as he travels on this project.

In all things, we praise Him and pray for new opportunities to share His love and truth to a hurting Nigeria.
