


From the Pastor's Desk

While we were in London in May we got a tour of Lloyd's of London, the legendary insurance and reinsurance market. As we learned in the tour, most of the business written at Lloyd's is still conducted face-to-face in the Underwriting Room which welcomes more than 5,000 people, sees £100m in premiums come into the market and £82.1m paid out in claims every single day! It is a business built on relationships, and those face-to-face meetings are key to establishing and maintaining those relationships.

Relationships take work; that is true of a business, a marriage, a friendship, a partnership, or a sports team. They demand trust, and when trust is broken, considerable effort is required to repair the fracture. Our faith too is very much about relationships – God's relationship with us, our relationship with God, and our relationships with one another. Jesus came to put us back into right relationship with God, a relationship fractured by our sin; and he calls us to be in right relationship with one another, to love and serve one another. God chooses to be in relationship with us as our Creator, Sustainer, and Redeemer; it is relationship grounded in love, and God promises that nothing – not even death – can separate us from God's love. Oddly, God gives us free will to



choose whether to be in relationship with God, and that provides the opportunity for sin to enter as we too often choose poorly. Rather than reject us, God chooses to love us through those poor choices, always inviting us back into right relationship with God. That relationship is nurtured by conversation, and while we can never stand face-to-face with God, we can talk with God through prayer.

What then are you doing to nurture your faith, to nurture your relationship with God? Scripture gives us shining examples of what God wants of us and for us. Jesus' example and teaching show us what healthy relationships look like. Might it be worthwhile then, to spend some time studying those examples and that guidance? Might it be worthwhile spending time talking with God and listening for God's voice speaking to you? Might it be worthwhile to nurture the relationships in your life by spending time with your friends and family but also in getting to know your neighbors, working to repair any fractures, and looking for new ways to serve one another in love?

Summer can be a time to kick back and relax away from the busy pace of the rest of the year. Perhaps this summer might be a good time too to work on your relationships – with God and with your neighbors all!




COMMUNITY BLODD DRIVE

An anonymous donor has paid the camp registration fees. The Outreach Team has allocated some funds to help cover the \$900 expense but needs a bit more to make it happen.


BAGS TO BENCHES
