From the Pastor's Desk

On Saturday, January 20, Session held its annual retreat here at the church. A significant focus for us was implementation of the Matthew 25 initiative here at Covenant. I shared some data around health equities in our community and beyond, and Adam Campbell provided for us some information with regard to the work of the DEI commission in the city in order to help us understand some of the challenges that have been identified for us locally. Following review of our Long-Range Plan and our annual goals for 2023, Session adopted the following priorities for 2024:

- Identify a Matthew 25 project and resource it appropriately.
- Understand and implement Christian Formation across the life of the church.
- Develop a plan for lay leadership & enabling identification of spiritual gifts.
- Share the good news in tangible ways beyond our walls and welcome community participation in the life of the church.

These priorities are in addition to our ongoing commitments to ministry and work in the life of the church (e.g. worship, outreach, etc.). In coming weeks and months there will be more information shared about

We hope that you will reflect on these questions and on these goals and join us in the conversation as we seek to discern where God is leading us, and then dare to follow that path!



One of the best health-care bargains around: Augusta Health's community wellness clinics. Next avail: Feb. 14, worth the trip despite unfriendly 7-10 a.m. hours. In addition to blood pressure checks and helpful hand-outs, AHC staff will perform stroke assessment, pulmonary function and carotid artery tests (often not covered by insurance). For \$10, you can have a cholesterol lipid screening. One caveat: You must make a reservation...call 540-245-7910.

Keeping the nasties at bay: We all know about filthy door handles and spigots in public restrooms, and I'm sure you remember to wipe down your cell phone daily And use hand sanitizer after using an ATM machine.

New to me: Plastic restaurant trays which the National Sanitation Foundation ranked among the highest bacteria-containing items in public spaces. "They were second only to kids' public park sandboxes – with


7,440 aerobic bacteria, yeast, and mold per gram – on par with school music instruments and movie theater video game controllers," according to a recent WebMd report.



Speaking of plastics: Pthalates ("thal-ayts") – those "forever chemicals" all over the news – really are ubiquiitous. They're in our food containers, medicine cabinets, oceans, bloodstreams: Basically, anywhere we have plastic anything. Known as "endocrine disruptors," they have been linked to breast cancer, birth defects, lowered sperm counts. It's impossible to live a plastic-free life, but we can decrease our exposure. Avoid plastic food containers and wrap containing PVC, or the recycling label #3. Avoid reheating food in plastic containers. Read ingredient lists for cosmetics and

personal care products. If you see: "Parfum," "fragrance," Di-n-butyl phthalate (DBP), Di-n-hexyl phthalate (DnHP), Diethyl phthalate (DEP)10, seek alternatives.
