

From the Pastor's Desk

This year Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day. On one hand it seems an odd mix – ashes and valentines, repentance and love, ash gray and rose red (Ohio State fans find that a perfect match) – but there is perhaps something fitting in celebrating these two remembrances on the same day. For, Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday are both rooted in love – love for one another, our love for God, and God's love for us.

Valentine's Day was originally a religious holiday, a feast day honoring the lives of various St. Valentines. Today, it is for us a secular holiday marked by expressions of love (sponsored by the Association of Florists, Hallmark, and the Chocolate Coalition of America). On Valentine's Day we express our love for others through cards and flowers, chocolates and those little candy hearts of my youth (Be Mine! I luv U!) which may have been the precursors to text messaging.

Ash Wednesday begins our 40-day journey through Lent to Holy Week. It is a day marked by repentance, prayer, and self-reflection, a day to set out on a Lenten journey that will end at the cross and the empty tomb where God's great love for us is expressed in profoundly tangible ways. As ashes are imposed on our foreheads,

As ashes mark our foreheads, we are reminded that we are dust and to dust we shall return, but even as we recall that sobering truth, we are reminded of Paul's words that nothing, not even death, can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Celebrating Ash Wednesday is an act of humble contrition, reminding us of our mortality, and it is an act of faith, bearing witness to our commitment to the God who loves us without end

This year, I encourage you to observe both days on February 14. Observe Valentine's Day for the sake of those you love, and observe Ash Wednesday for the sake of the God who loves you. For in doing so, we live into the Great Commandment: Love God with all that you are, and love your neighbor as yourself!

Chances are approximately 100 percent that we all know someone who is a caregiver. "Caregiving" is at best complicated: A difficult mix of love, practicality, guilt and fear that the care we're giving is not enough. The "ifs" and "buts" can be overwhelming for the estimated 53 million Americans currently serving as unpaid caregivers to spouses, relatives, regivers and special needs children.

> **Friday is National Caregivers' Day**, a chance to let caregivers know you appreciate their work. You can go big – a weekend at the beach while you assume caregiving duties – but, according to researchers, it's the "little things" that actually help. "You don't need to 'fix' anything; you just need to care and to validate their perspectives. . . Tell them it's OK to sometimes feel resentment, anger and frustration, along with the joy," one


wrote. Often, a hug, a shared moment of quiet or prayer (and an offer to clean the kitchen!) are really all that's needed.

There's even scientific evidence that stress-relieving encouragement can help caregivers maintain their own health. One NIH study found a strong correlation between the stress involved in caregiving (especially of special needs children) and the length of caregivers' telomeres. Telomeres cap the end of chromosomes and protect them from degradation: Shortened telomeres – often triggered by

stress -- have been associated with several adverse health conditions and earlier mortality, the study posited. To read the complete study, check out "The Association Between Informal Caregiving and Cellular Aging,"



Also, many miscellaneous hygiene items, including tons of lip balm! Plus innumerable caps, scarves, gloves, and socks!

Thanks to everyone at Covenant for the generous support of people just starting to rebuild their lives after doing time in jail. We pray that God's grace and strength be with them as they seek to regain successful and



useful new lives in this community.

Mr. John Lilly, Chief of Programs at MRRJ, was most appreciative. He mentioned again that he is available for future conversation with us about the needs of people beginning reentry in our area.
