

From the Pastor's Desk

As we move into Holy Week, there is a temptation to rush from Palm Sunday to Easter, from hosannas to alleluias, without having to endure the harsh reality of the cross and Jesus' cry, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me!" As a friend once said to me, "The whole crucifixion thing is so depressing!" The cross IS depressing - and violent and frightening as the Romans intended it to be; it was an instrument of torture! But we cannot call ourselves Jesus' disciples without stopping there on our way to the empty tomb. We cannot appreciate the joy of his resurrection without also appreciating his suffering on Calvary. We cannot understand his call to follow him without following him to the cross, for there he showed us what sacrificial love is.

"If you would be my disciple, then deny yourself, take up your cross daily, and follow me," Jesus says. Jesus insists that we too bear the cross as his disciples, that we follow him even when it is hard! Most of us want to be disciples without suffering in any way; we want to share the good news of Easter without recalling Jesus' agonizing death on Good Friday. We wear shiny smooth crosses as a symbol of our faith without remembering

that the cross was a brutal instrument of death that has been repurposed as a sign of the trust, hope, and peace we find in the crucified and risen Jesus.

Dietrick Bonhoeffer, who as a prisoner ministered to guards and other prisoners in a Nazi prison camp, spoke of "the cost of discipleship", which is to say that often it is not easy to follow where Jesus leads us. The crosses we bear are sometimes painful – figuratively if not literally - but we are called to follow anyway. Those who embrace a prosperity gospel suggest that discipleship is all rosy blessings. That is not the path Jesus walked, nor is it the path we are called to walk as his disciples! That is why the events of this Holy Week the joyous and the painful - are important for us to recall.

This week, take some time on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday to remember Jesus' sacrifice for us before we gather again on Easter morning to celebrate the joyful, hopeful promises we hold in his resurrection. For it is all part of the story of salvation – the cross and the empty tomb – for us and for the world! Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again.

# Missionary UPDATE

It's been a while since we've shared pictures of our project site where the community center will be built, so we wanted to give you a quick update. We are working hard to be able to start doing our agricultural trainings at our project site, because for our trainings to be most effective, we need to have demonstration gardens growing so people can see, with their own eyes, the effectiveness of this new method of farming.

#### FROM FAITH'S HEART — Feb. 2024 Update (Crystal & Raphael)



We currently have three things going on there:

- We are working with Ika Christian Mission to renovate some buildings that they will allow us to use for accommodation and lectures until we have our own buildings built,
- 2) we are preparing a 2.5-acre field using the pfumvudza method right on the project site! (in the picture you can see our guys working to get a full mulch cover on the field, and
- 3) we are making arrangements to start the fencing of the property (finally!). We have also submitted an application for some grant money to enable us to build our first building — a training hall.

With all of this going on, in addition to still holding trainings and getting ready to plant our commercial crops in May (maize, soybeans, rice, peanuts, and more this year!), we have some busy months ahead. Please pray for strength and wisdom, for the remaining funds for the fence to be provided, and that our grant application will be received favorably.



Surprising (to me) news from the Pew Research Center: **Fewer than 40 percent of U.S. teens and their parents argue about** "**phone time**" — and only 10 percent reported arguing frequently. Even better, a quarter of the parents – and 31 percent of their children – say they never argue about phone use.

But ... almost half the teens (46 percent) said their parents were more than occasionally distracted by their own phones at times when they should have been paying attention to their children.

"How Teens and Parents Approach Screen Time," released earlier this month, was based on Fall 2023 interviews with 1,453 U.S. teens ages 13 to 17 and their parents and includes dozens of interesting (sometimes surprising) factoids about our digital lives. Worth noting: A 2022 Pew study showed that 95% of U.S.13-year olds up have a smart-phone, with 97% saying they use the internet daily. Among 13- and 14-year-olds, 61% said they use TikTok and 51% said they use Snapchat. Older teens (15 to 17) use those social media platforms at higher rates, with 71% saying they use TikTok and 65% using Snapchat. **We may be living longer....** A two-year-long decline in U.S. longevity seems to be reversing itself, a new CDC report suggests.

**Life expectancy rose** to an average of 77.5 years (an increase of 1.1 years) between 2021 and 2022, and the death rate overall decreased by more than nine percent, according to "Mortality In the United States, 2022," released March 14.

Leading causes of death remained the same, although Covid dropped from third to fourth place. Top 10 (in 2022) were: heart disease, cancers, unintentional injuries, COVID, stroke, chronic respiratory diseases, Alzheimer's, diabetes, kidney disease, and chronic liver disease (including cirrhosis).

One distressing statistic emerges in the report's numbers: Our infant mortality rate increased by 3.1%, with 20,553 children younger than 1year old dying in 2022.
