

From the Pastor's Desk

Earlier this month our dear friend Jim Simpson died at age 90. Jim was a minister in the Church of Scotland, and our families have been like one large family since my dad and Jim did a pulpit exchange for three months in the summer of 1971. We saw Jim just last summer when we were in Scotland. In January of 1996 Jim was here to preach at Covenant when the Blizzard of '96 derailed those plans; after a week of being snowbound by 30+ inches of snow, Jim commented, "I will never again dream of a white Christmas!" For many years Jim was pastor of the Dornoch Cathedral in the far north of Scotland – an historic church that is over 750 years old! He was moderator of the Church of Scotland, chaplain to Queen Elizabeth, a regular contributor to The Presbyterian Outlook and to Life and Work (the Church of Scotland's monthly magazine), and authored several books. He was an avid golfer, and offered the blessing at the dinner for the Ryder Cup teams a few years back. In his life, his sermons, and his writing, Jim was a gifted story-teller. Many of his stories related to congregational life, some from his own experience and some that he collected from others over time, often with an eye for the humor in it all. Minnie Pearl once said that "laughter is the hand of God on the shoulder of a troubled world." With his stories, Jim offered God's loving hand to a great many troubled shoulders on both sides of the Atlantic across the years!

Stories are at the heart of our tradition and our lives. Last weekend some folks chalked pictures of favorite Bible stories onto the pavement in the front parking lot here. Many of



those stories were first heard by the chalkers when they were young tots. Stories like Noah and the Ark, Jonah and the whale. David and Goliath. Jesus walking on water, and the empty tomb at Easter have been told again and again across generations. Are there some of those Bible stories that you treasure? What stories might you tell from your own life that further illustrate God's hand at work in our midst? For as Jim Simpson's legacy, the Biblical witness, and the testimony of a host of Covenant folks attests: God is still at work among us, in us, through us, and around us in surprising, creative, and sometimes amusing ways. You don't have to write a book or preach a sermon to share such stories; you can tell them to a child or grandchild, a friend, a pewmate, or even a pastor, for in so doing we share the Good News and live into our calling to be heralds of the Gospel which is still good news for all generations!

FROM FAITH'S HEART — April 2024 Update (Crystal & Raphael)

Have you ever experienced an amazing coincidence? We have! Too many of them to think of them as random chance—we know that God orchestrates things to fulfill His purposes, so we like to call them God-instances instead of coincidences.

Through a series of these God-instances, we were introduced to the wonderful work of <u>MeCAHT</u> (Media Coalition and Awareness to Halt Trafficking) and their residential April 2024









and after-care services for rescued trafficking victims here in Abuja. In April, we had the privilege of hosting a small group from MeCAHT at one of our 3-day trainings.

Trafficking victims are another highly vulnerable group that often does not have much access to resources or land. The <u>pfumvudza</u> model is perfect for them because it provides a way to feed oneself on just a 17 m x 40 m piece of land. "I would like to say that the training brought hope to me personally. We have been buying corn to feed our girls, but with this, I think it's very easy for us to cultivate enough to feed [them] with just a little portion of land." Just 3 hours after the training ended, they were already gathering materials for their compost pile!

Teaching them how God can help us redeem the destroyed soil gives us the opportunity to share with them how He can also redeem their own stories of brokenness and pain.



You don't have to visit the beach to make a sandcastle. Make fluffy "moon sand" to build fun structures.

What you need:

- Large bowl
- Wooden spoon
- 8 cups flour
- 1 cup baby oil



What you do:

- Measure flour into the large bowl. Add baby oil.
- Mix thoroughly until all the oil is combined and the texture is consistent. If needed, use your hands to knead the mixture.
- The sand is ready when it sticks together to form a ball when pressed in your hands.
- Use sand toys and molds to create a sandcastle. Store sand in an airtight container for up to two weeks.




MAKE A DIFFERENCE WITH PLASTIC BAGS

It's hard to give up our own learning time during the Sunday school hour for a whole year. And our own busy schedules don't always allow for such a lengthy commitment of time. But I wonder if you might have a month that you would be willing to commit to the faith formation of our children. For three or four weeks, you can be the shepherd that welcomes them into the stories and plays alongside them before handing the task over to another shepherd. The children get to see the breadth of love for them in this community as many hands come together to care for them. Blending this with the consistency of one or two teachers that are there all year, children are nurtured by the whole community.

For some, the idea of teaching Sunday school is daunting. Kids have boundless energy and ask questions with no simple answers. But taking it one month at a time offers a way for adults to try it out, exploring something just outside their comfort zone. Taking it one month at a time means that adults have plenty of time to tend to their own faith formation the rest of year. Taking it one month at a time models the practice of sharing the load with the entire family of God.

As we move into the month of July, consider this offering of love and see if you hear God calling to you ministry in this way. If you have questions, contact Rae. Ey'll be happy to talk to you about it, show you the new curriculum, and help discern what might be the best fit for you.
