# From the Pastor's Desk

#### A NOTE FROM RACHEL—

Why Sunday School? With all the things vying for our time, why should we spend an hour on this? Maybe it's important for our kids, but didn't we graduate with our Christian Education diploma after confirmation? Isn't the worship hour enough?

Well, simply put...because Christian Formation is a lifelong process that grows and changes with us. Because God's not done with us yet and still calls us into partnership throughout our entire lifetime. Because God is a communal God...Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Holy Three, Holy One...and made us for community too, so we need each other to even begin to understand this great mystery of faith. Because the God we praise is a living God whose truths are steadfast but whose church grows and changes as the people of God grow and change. Because Christian Formation classes give us the chance to ask, to dig in, and to imagine together so our faith can be deepened and ourselves transformed as disciples.

It IS an hour (or two or three) and we ARE people who are bound by limited time. And it's a choice to get up early on Sunday or stay late after the service. No longer is our society built around church time and there are a million things we can and probably should do before the work week starts again, so choosing anything that takes this much time is a big deal. Yet it is our gift and our calling to share our time with each other and with God, so we might be able to figure out this kindom living thing in a messy world. Our Christian Formation team is deep in discussion about the why and how of Christian formation. We are dedicated to making the time you spend with us valuable, carefully considering what is being taught and how it builds across our entire life and discerning the best ways to steward our time and resources. This includes changes for our middle and high schoolers - incorporating technology - online

gathering spaces, video devotionals, and phone check-ins alongside weekly Sunday School and monthly YOUth group and Manna events. We're exploring new Sunday School topics for adults and creative ways to meet with parents and older adults that meet their specific needs and challenges.

## FROM FAITH'S HEART — November 2024 Update

November was a busy month! In addition to training over 100 farmers through two separate 1-day programs in Plateau State and another 30 in our last 3-day program of 2024 in Abuja, Raph and the team worked on the solar panel installation you see on the front of this card for the





computing department at the Federal University of Lafia.

While our primary focus is on feeding the hungry and sharing the Gospel through regenerative agriculture, we are also still dedicated to bringing light (and Light!) everywhere we go. With almost half (42%) of Nigerians not even on the national power grid and at least 11 nationwide grid collapses in 2024 alone, reliable energy is a huge need for most of the country. So when the university reached out with a request to assist in procuring the necessary equipment to power their Data Center, we were happy to assist, ensuring they received quality equipment and proper installation for smooth running for a long time.

Doing things with excellence and integrity is how we shine Christ's light and stand out in the darkness of a country often characterized by corruption—not only in government and business but also in the church. Thanking God for new opportunities to shine in the darkness and praying to always be prepared to give an answer for the hope that is in us.


