From the Pastor's Desk

When I was growing up in Slippery Rock, PA in the 1960s and 1970s Lent was celebrated pretty much only by the Catholic Church in town. We Presbyterians knew it was Lent because the schools served fish sticks every Friday through those weeks, but in our church, we did little in the way of observance. We did have an Ash Wednesday service (without imposition of ashes) and a Maundy Thursday service, but otherwise Lent was barely noticed. Over the years, how-ever, Presbyterians have rediscovered what our Catholic friends knew all along – that Lent is worthy of observance for it makes us conscious of our need for repentance and renewal and prepares us for the celebration of the Resurrection at Easter.

Here we began our observance of Lent with the imposition of ashes last Wednesday; we countdown the weeks to Easter with Lenten devotionals to focus our attention and prayers, Taizé worship each Wednesday evening, a simple meal of soup and bread at Together on Wednesday dinners (without desserts!), and perhaps by practicing a Lenten discipline (giving up something for these weeks, fasting, committing to pray or read Scripture, or engaging in some form of service). The purpose is not to prove publicly how holy we are, but to acknowledge privately how holy we are NOT! It is to take time to assess our faith and faithfulness in an intentional way and to recommit to do better – not in the world's eyes, but in God's eyes!

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK (cont'd)

There are a host of other things going on that threaten to distract us from any Lenten observance - the arrival of sprina, March Madness, senioritis, spring breaks, breaking news about what is newly broken in our nation or world – and it can be tempting to lose sight of the journey toward the cross these forty days. The same distractions tempt us to take for aranted the agony of the cross and the good news of the empty tomb. Why pay attention to something that happened so long ago when there is so much happening now! The answer of course is that what happened long ago very much impacts our lives today and our hope for tomorrow. "If you would be my disciple, then deny yourself, take up your cross daily, and follow me," says Jesus. If we are to be his disciples, then we need to recall something of what that cross meant for him and what its implication are for us and our discipleship. We need to travel that road with him to the cross and then to the empty tomb. For it is there that hope is born for us in life beyond death; it is there that we find strength to persevere in the present.

So, take time in these coming weeks to observe a holy Lent, not because you have to, but because in so doing, you may grow closer to God and to being the person God calls you to be – a faithful disciple of the crucified and risen Lord!






TOW Talks return this Wednesday. On the roster: Insightful, provocative – occasionally amusing – discussions about gender, money and emotional and mental health. Come for the talks; stay for the camaraderie, the soup and truly amazing salads served at our Lenten suppers.

March 12: Associate Pastor Rae Watson begins the series with **LBGQT-What?**, a frank exploration of the alphabet soup we wish we understood, and its impact on our lives.

March 19: Seth Ward and Tammy Scott of United Bank will address the growing problem of Fraud and Financial Elder Abuse. Many of us know Seth as an Elder, musician and chair of the Fellowship Committee, but he's also worked for United Bank for more than 10 years, currently as a personal banker in their Harrisonburg Main office. He will bring United Bank branch manager (Harrisonbura) Tammy Scott with him.



Between them they've witnessed, resolved and prevented scores of scams and frauds. We're a savvy group at Covenant, but – according to a Bankrate survey taken earlier this month – we (and most of America) are subject to fraud and scams. Before coming to this talk, check out the following link for some eye-popping statistics about exactly who is being targeted and scammed. March 26: Seth and Ms. Scott return to discuss **Financial Literacy**. This talk is geared to older adults, with topics ranging from how money is insured and how much money to keep in accounts, to basic smart money management.

April 2: Rae returns with **Where's the Manual? Emotional Health in Our Children**. Just what is "gentle parenting" and have I destroyed my child's ego by yelling? What if I miss a night of bedtime stories or can't make it to the school play? Parent (and grandparent)-hood is fraught with doubts. As a veteran teacher-turned-pastor who focuses much energy on our Youth programs, Rae is familiar with children's abilities (or problems with) expressing emotions, coping with feelings and forming nurturing relationships. We'll explore new ways to build relationships and nurture emotional health in our children.

April 9: Rae will offer the sequel to **Emotional Health**, with **Where's the Manual? Youth Mental Health**. Today's teens are under enormous pressures undreamed of even a generation ago: Anxiety, depression and other mental health issues are rising. Led by Rae, we'll discuss ways our families and churches can help protect emotional health, build healthy coping skills and care for the mental health of our youth during this critical life stage.

FROM FAITH'S HEART — February 2025 Update (Crystal & Raphael)

Early last year, we shared that we and Equipping Farmers International (EFI) were partnering with Ika Christian Mission to upgrade some dorm buildings that they have generously agreed to let us use for accommodation for our training programs, in between the Christian camps that they host, until we are able to build dorm buildings on our project site.

We are excited to announce that not only is the upgrade completed, but we were able to use the dorms for a training for the first time this month! From February 10-13, we held two 2-day regenerative agriculture trainings for 60 students and staff, hosted by Ika Bible School, at the site.

This training also helps us realize another one of our goals—to start introducing this training to Bible school students across Nigeria and to eventually have it become part of their curriculum. (Also in attendance was the provost of another Bible school who hopes to bring the training to his school soon, too!) EFI specifically focuses on cultivating agricultural discipleship for enhanced food security and livelihoods, envisioning a network of churches eradicating hunger and insecurity globally. (Learn more at <u>efi-intl.org.</u>) Equipping pastors-in -training with this knowledge helps to fulfill this vision. It's just another way of using regenerative agriculture to help share the Gospel!


